We had a machine in, which was used to cut back some of the gorse on the course. The main reason for this was to help keep the Rabbits away from the fairways. We are all aware of the

damage that they were doing and since this has been done there has been far less evidence of fresh rabbit droppings or indeed the rabbits themselves. Patching work will be the next step and once this has been done and had time to bed in, we should see a massive difference. None of this work has taken anything away from either the look or the difficulty of the course. Once the grass grows, we will have a distinct difference between, fairway, semi rough and heavy rough before reaching the gorse on the holes where gorse has been removed.
